A new, upgraded online registration system for Cerritos Library programs will soon be available. The new system, RACER Powered by CivicRec, provides excellent processing speed and capacity, so patrons will not experience a delay in the online registration process. To use the new system, patrons will need to first register for RACER (Register for Activities, Classes and Excursions Rapidly) accounts for themselves and their family members. 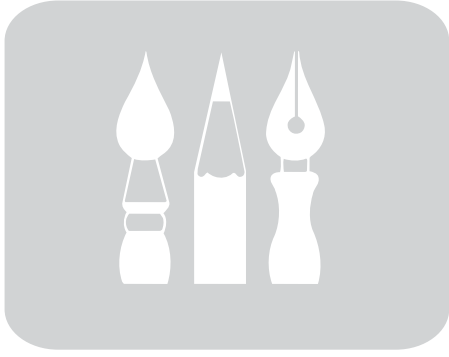

Registration

Online registration will be available from Monday, June 11 through Sunday, June 17 on the Library's website at cerritoslibrary.us and requires one valid Cerritos Library card per household. Participants who register online need to bring their Cerritos Library card to the Art Studio located in the Children's Library during Registration Week. Walk-in registration will be held Monday, June 18 through Sunday, June 24 in the Art Studio in the Children's Library. Each participant must be present to register or their valid Cerritos Library card must be presented. In addition, each member of the family must be present to claim their grand prize. A separate form will need to be completed for each person who signs up for the program to receive their reading log.

Prizes and Programs

Children up to age 11 who read 30 minutes per day are eligible for Summer Reading program prizes. Young adults, ages 12 to 17, and adults, ages 18 and older, must complete four books, either fiction or non-fiction, in any language. Prizes will be distributed while supplies last during Registration Week: June 18-24, June 25-July 1, July 2-8, and July 9-15; and Grand Prize Weeks: July 16-28. In addition, the Summer Reading Program will include various performers, activities and entertainment for the entire family. LIBRARY RFID SYSTEM UPGRADE UNDERWAY

A project to replace the Cerritos Library's radio frequency identification (RFID) system is underway, including the installation of new self-checkout stations, security gates, RFID tags, circulation desk equipment and system software. The system will allow self-checkout of materials and provide security for the collection. The original RFID system that has been in place since 2002 operates with proprietary RFID tags that are no longer manufactured.

During the transition from the old RFID system to the new system, there will be a period of time when the self-checkout stations are not available and patrons will need to bring materials to the Circulation Desk to have items checked out by staff. It is anticipated the project will be completed by the end of September 2018.

The new self-checkout stations will allow patrons to check out multimedia items, such as CDs, DVDs and Blu-Ray discs, as well as books. The self-checkout stations will also allow for the payment of fines and fees by credit card. The self-checkout software is designed for fast and efficient checkout. Audible, visual, touch and text features guide users through the self-service transaction. The self-checkout stations offer patrons the option of selecting from 50 different foreign languages for the on-screen display. The language options include Chinese (simplified and traditional), Hindi, Hmong, Japanese, Korean, Spanish, Tagalog, Tamil and Urdu.

As part of its mission to support the Cerritos Library, the Friends of the Cerritos Library generously contributed \$15,000 toward the system replacement. The Friends are also volunteering their time to help the Cerritos Library staff place new RFID tags on each item in the collection.
